

COCCULUS LEAVES

Cocculus laurifolius (common name laurel-leaved snail tree) is a medium sized tree of the genus Cocculus. It is native to Japan and China.





CYNOGLOSSUM

Is a specie of Stachys, native to Turkey, Armenia, and Iran. It is cultivated over much of the temperate world as an ornamental plant, and is naturalised in some locations as an escapee from grardens. Plants are very often found under the synonym Stachys lanata or Stachys olympica.





ROSE LEAVES

A leaf is an organ of a vascular plant and is the principal lateral appendage of the stem. The leaves and stem together from the shoot. Foliage is a mass noun that refers to leaves collectively.



FOX TAIL

Aethiopicus asparagus, Sprenger's asparagus, is a plant original from South Africa. Usually used as an ornamental plant. Asparagus and Fox tail fern are common names; nevertheless, has no connection with the real fern.



MING FERN

A part from the traditional use as a filler, take advantage of the each individual branch to form small feather-like prairies in green walls or "landscape" arrangements.



LYCOPODIUM

Is the most widespread species in the genus Lycopodium of the clubmoss family Lycopodiaceae, growing mainly prostrate along the ground with stems up to 1 m long; the stems are much branched, and densely clothed with small, spirally arranged leaves.





TREE FERN

The order Cyatheales, which includes the tree fern, is a taxonomic division of the fern class, Polypodiopsida. Some species in the Cyatheales have tree-like growth forms, but other have creeping rhizomes (stems).







BUXUS

Buxus is a genus of about 70 species in the family Buxaceae. Common names include box (majority of English-speaking countries) or boxwood (North America). They are slow-growing evergreen shrubs and small trees, growing to 2–12 m (rarely 15 m) tall.





PAPYRUS

The papyrus family consists of over 700 registered species distributed found all over the world. The Cyperus papyrus, originating in Africa, is of significant historical importance due its application in the paper-like material used among others by the ancient Egyptians.
